What happens when I finish School?

It is government policy that students leaving Year 11 need to remain in learning until they are 18.

What about the future?

It is essential that all young people get as much careers information, advice and guidance as possible. This is the only way to make suitable educational and employment decisions. Whether you are leaving Year 11 or Sixth Form, there are lots of options available to you.

So:

- Look at the <u>School website</u> and click on <u>careers</u> <u>information</u>. There is a wealth of information for young people and parents.
- Contact an independent Careers Adviser through the <u>National Careers Service</u>. You can do this online or telephone 0800 100 900 (8:00am to 10:00pm, 7 days a week.
- Talk with the family: what are your skills, interests and motivations?
- Talk with your teachers.
- Use the internet to research .

After Year 11

Young people can choose from one of the following options:

- Full-time education, such as school or college
- Work-based learning, such as an Apprenticeship
- Part-time education or training if they are employed, self-employed or volunteering for more than 20 hours a week.

There is a huge choice of lots of different qualifications including A Levels, more GCSEs, apprenticeships and vocational courses.

After Year 13

Young people can choose from courses in Higher Education, FE College, Apprenticeship or full time employment. All students have access to <u>Unifrog</u> to help with this decision process.

It is **never too soon** to start thinking about careers, get informed, find out, talk to people and develop your own action plan.
