Arrangements for next term – pupils return on Thursday 6th January *

The arrival of Omicron has ensured the pandemic is still with us, sadly, so once again we are required to <u>conduct lateral flow tests</u> for pupils at the beginning of term. We will start these on the first day back on **Thursday 6th January** and into the following week. We also ask you to continue twice weekly testing at home. In addition, we request that parents, guardians, and other visitors take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before entering the school. Thank you. We are advised by Norfolk County Council that lateral flow test kits are readily available for free at local libraries and pharmacies.

Latest government Advice

From Tuesday 14 December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 has been introduced in England. All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19.
