The Papillon Project is an educational charity that promotes sustainable living and environmental



awareness for young people.

It is their very dedicated mission to help rehearse the next generation to know how to grow their own food so we can all start to live in a world that is greener and far more sustainable.

This mission is achieved by creating and developing school allotments using mainly recycled, reclaimed and up cyclable (creative reuse) materials. They believe a school allotment should be a 'permanent place of inspirational learning' and all secondary schools and sixth-form colleges should have one! They passionately believe that a school allotment provides the most *incredible* opportunities for crucial and highly valuable life skills to be taught and imparted to young people. Arrangements for next term

The pandemic is still with us, sadly, so once again we are required to conduct lateral flow tests for pupils twice at the beginning of term. In order to prevent a staggered start to the term, we are inviting pupils to take their first test before term begins, if they are able to get to school and home again as below:

Pre-term Covid testing in the Vocational Centre

Pupils attend for the test only and go home immediately. NB No school transport is provided. Pupils must make their own way to school and home again. Uniform is not required.

Thursday 2nd September -	Year 8 – at 9.00am in the Vocational Centre Year 9 – at 11.00am in the Vocational Centre
Friday 3rd September -	Year 10 – at 9.00am Year 11 – at 11.00am Year 13 – at 1.00pm

Monday 6th September

<u>Only Year 7 and Year 12</u> will be attending on the first Monday back for their induction days. Their Covid tests will be organised during the day and school uniform should be worn by Year 7 students. School buses will be running on this day and the canteen will be open.

Tuesday 7th September

All Year groups return to school in full school uniform

We will conduct the second Covid tests over the subsequent five days.

All parents are strongly encouraged to continue testing at home twice a week throughout the summer. Free test kits are easily available from any local pharmacy.
