Year 12 fieldtrips – Geography and Biology

Year 12 Geographers and Biologists spent three days in Dorset collecting data for their Geography Nonexamined Assessment (NEA) and Biology fieldwork at Studland sand dunes and the town of Boscombe. They were based at the youth hostel in the village of Lulworth near Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door where they spent their free time exploring. Students also visited Old Harry Rocks, the coastal town of Swanage and Agglestone Rock, known locally as the Devil's Anvil!

Year 10 fieldtrip to Sheringham

Over two days, approximately 90 Year 10 pupils visited the town of Sheringham to investigate the impact of sea defences on coastal landforms. Pupils carried out beach profiles, sediment analysis and collected data on the physical processes that influence the coastline too. Despite a busy day, everyone managed to find time for chips and an ice-cream!





Engineering Day

This half term, year 7 and 9 students were involved in an exciting Women in STEM morning with TTP, the technology partnership for Cambridge. Year 7 students investigated how electricity and magnetism works, while learning how to solder their very own metal detectors. Year 9 students applied their energy knowledge to build the slowest vertical marble run made from recycled materials.

Learning from the professionals...

Ten students from years 7 to 12 visited Diss Allotments to see how experienced gardeners grow a wide variety of vegetables, fruit and flowers. They tried to identify as many different plants as possible, learning to recognise some of the foods they can buy in the shops in their growing form. Bernard was a lovely host, and it was a very interesting and enjoyable visit.



Courtyard Garden

This year, a small group of year 7 students took it upon themselves to revamp a small courtyard within the school. They created a small wildlife garden by planting colourful and nectar rich plants in borders and derelict bathtubs. They also designed a bug hotel with the



help of Mr. Veil in DT club and at lunch time. They painted picnic tables and created a couple of tile mosaics to brighten up the area. It is an ongoing project and they have worked hard in order to make a haven for themselves as well as wildlife.

Sixth Form News

The summer term is always a busy time in Sixth Form. Following the mock exams, a new Sixth Form Committee was elected.
