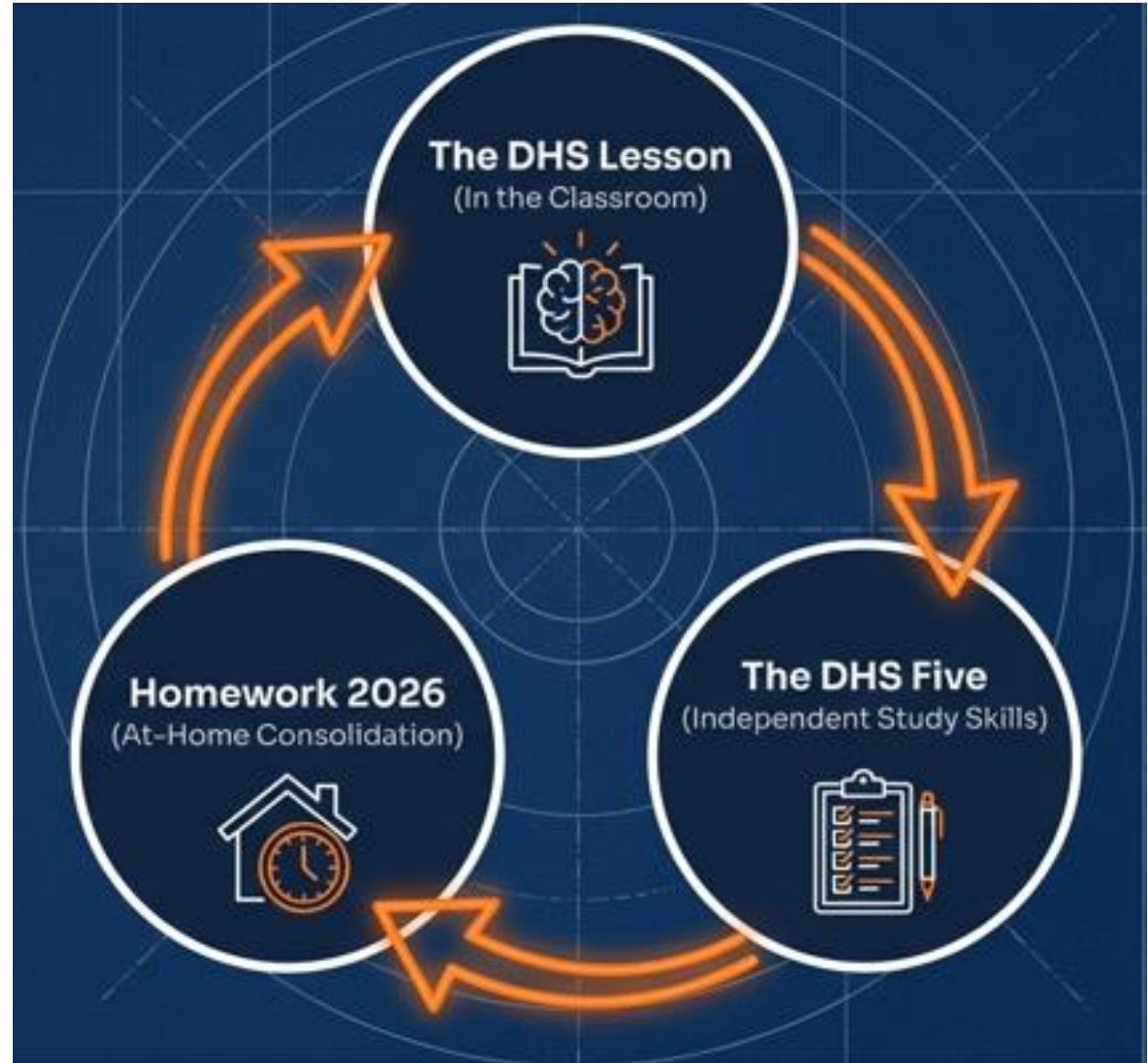

All subjects will set 30 minutes of homework per week.

Year 11 Note: As KS4 courses progress into Year 11, homework duration and complexity may increase to include short, exam-style tasks and application of knowledge in readiness for exams.

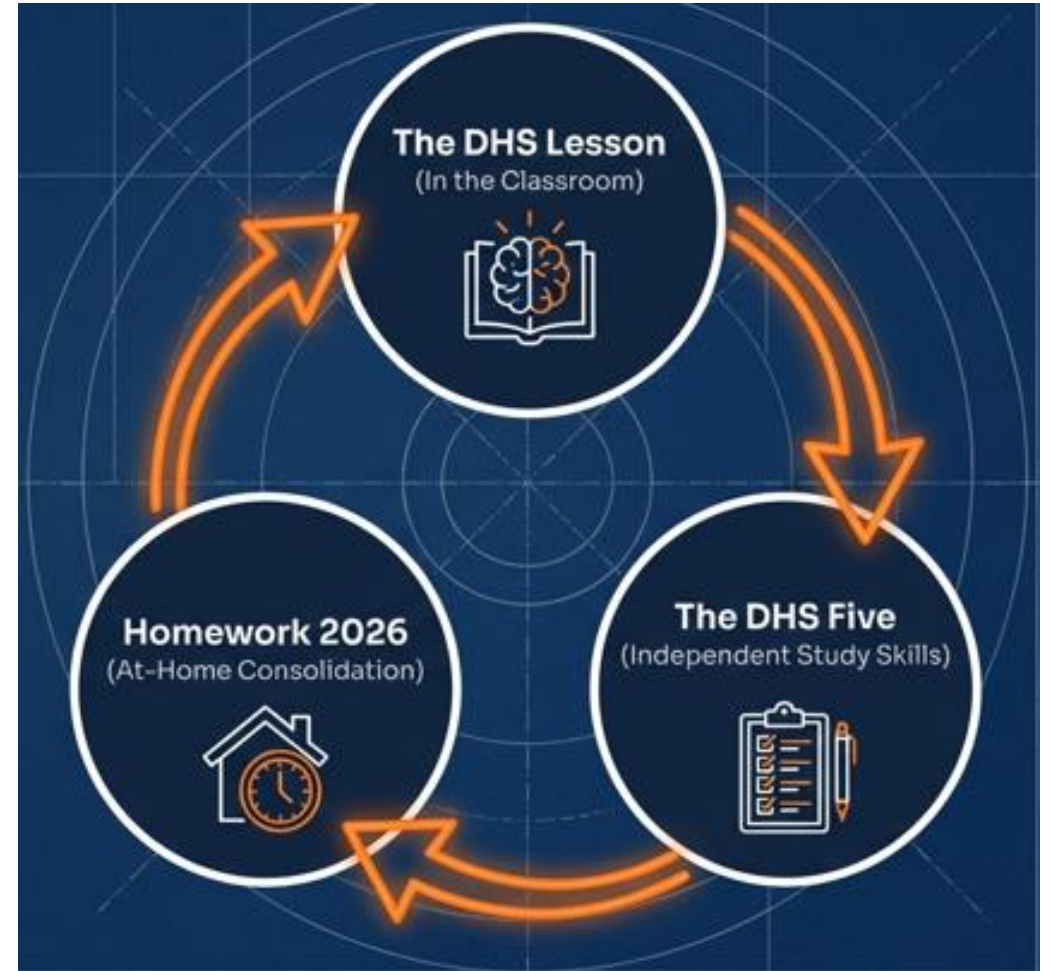

The loop back

- All revision homework leads directly back to an **extended retrieval starter** (10 questions);
- Students will practise using one of the **DHS Five revision strategies** as evidence of their homework.



Homework logistics

- Homework will be put on Bromcom with a clear deadline;
- Students will write this homework down in their planners during 'the Final Five';
- Planners should be out every lesson;
- Students will have a homework exercise book with an envelope in the back to complete revision homework. This should be with them everyday.

Homework Sanction Flowchart: A Guide to Success

A progressive system of intervention for missed homework to ensure student accountability.

Level C0 (The First Slip)



The first missed homework in a subject per term serves as an initial warning.

Level C1 (Second Offence)



Triggers a Bromcom record, 15-minute lunchtime faculty detention, and teacher-led parent email contact.

Level C2 (Persistent Offence)



Third missed homework triggers mandatory homework club and contact from the Head of Faculty.

Final Stage (Non-compliance)



A parent meeting is held to review patterns and address specific barriers to completion.



The Termly Reset

The homework tally for every student resets at the start of every term.
